RESOLUTION NO. 2033

A RESOLUTION DETERMINING THE CONTRACT FOR FABRICATION AND INSTALLATION OF SCULPTURAL BRONZE ARTWORK WITH INTERPRETIVE ELEMENTS AT THE NEW BOECKMAN ROAD BRIDGE IS A SPECIAL PROCUREMENT CONTRACT EXEMPT FROM **FORMAL COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION REQUIREMENTS:** AUTHORIZING **EXECUTION OF SPECIALLY PROCURED** CONTRACT FOR **INNOVATIVE** METAL DESIGN, LLC (IMD); AND VERIFYING **FUND** AVAILABILITY FOR THE PROJECT KNOWN AS BOECKMAN ROAD EXTENSION

WHEREAS, the City of Wilsonville is currently constructing an extension of Boeckman Road from 95th Street to Tooze Road; and

WHEREAS, this road extension project includes the construction of a 400 foot long bridge which will span Coffee Lake Creek (Seely Ditch) and approximately 3,390 linear feet of wetland; and

WHEREAS, the design of the proposed bridge includes two 6-foot shoulder bike lanes and a 10-foot-wide multi-use trail, which will be a section of the regional Tonquin Trail; and

WHEREAS, because the bridge will carry pedestrian and bicycle traffic in addition to vehicular traffic, there is an opportunity to enhance both the visual and educational experience and create added value to the streetscape and public infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the location of the proposed bridge provides a special contextual opportunity to observe the adjacent wetland habitat; and

WHEREAS, artistic and interpretive elements in this location would invite pedestrians and cyclists to take pause and notice the changes in the land forms and ecosystems of the area and provide educational material for review; and

WHEREAS, Staff has previously contracted with Mayer/Reed to design artistic and interpretive elements to be included on the bridge; and

WHEREAS, the completed design includes an interpretive pylon at each end of the bridge imbedded with sign panels to provide information on the history of the geology, flora and fauna of the area, and stone planters accentuated with sculptural elements representing local wetland flora; and

WHEREAS, the cost estimate for fabricating and installing the designed interpretive art elements is \$190,270.00, including 10% contingency; and

WHEREAS, this cost represents 0.77% of the cost of the entire Boeckman Road extension project; and

WHEREAS, since the design consists of sculptural bronze pieces with interpretive elements which are complex, distinctive pieces of art, it is essential the pieces be manufactured and installed by artisans uniquely suited to this type of work; and

WHEREAS, Staff has determined it is necessary to identify a specific contractor capable of the attention to detail and fine craftsmanship needed for fabricating and installing these sorts of unique pieces of art; and

WHEREAS, project designers Mayer/Reed have worked with Innovative Metal Design, LLC (IMD) and their team of artisans on several unique projects over the years including a sculptural icon incorporating complex metal fabrication and custom burnished finishes at the Eastern Washington State Historical Society Museum in Spokane; a steel and bronze campus landmark integrated into a stone masonry wall at Pacific Lutheran University in Seattle; and illuminated steel and glass kiosks marking the Portland Art Museum's three entries; and

WHEREAS, IMD has worked with Mayer/Reed on the design of interpretive and artistic pieces for the Boeckman Road project and has provided guidance on structural detailing, material sourcing, sizing, metal finish options, and cost estimating; and

WHEREAS, IMD has a complete understanding of the design's fabrication, structural engineering, and artistic requirements; and

WHEREAS, ORS279C.335 Competitive bidding; exceptions; exemptions, subsection (2) allows local contract review boards to exempt a public improvement from competitive bidding if the exemption is unlikely to encourage favoritism in the awarding of public contracts and if the exemption will result in substantial cost savings to the public; and

WHEREAS, City of Wilsonville Ordinance No. 578 establishes that the Wilsonville City Council is the Local Contract Review Board under the State of Oregon Public Contracting code; and

WHEREAS it is found that a special procurement contract for the fabrication and installation of these artistic pieces is unlikely to encourage favoritism or substantially diminish competition for public improvement contracts as the art fabrication is a unique project for the

City that is singularly different from typical public improvement projects; and

WHEREAS, it is found that by exempting the proposed contract from competitive bidding, the local contract review board will result in substantial cost savings as there are limited numbers of qualified contractors available to do work of such unique artistic nature and that the quality of work necessary for fabricating these pieces is likely to be achieved through an exemption; and

WHEREAS, ORS279C.335 Competitive bidding; exceptions; exemptions, subsection (3) requires that when granting exemptions to competitive bidding the local contract review board shall require and approve or disapprove written findings that support the exemption from competitive bidding; and

WHEREAS, this Resolution provides said written findings; and

WHEREAS, ORS279C.335 Competitive bidding; exceptions; exemptions, subsection (4)(a) requires that the contracting agency shall hold a public hearing, and provide statutorily mandated notice to said hearing, prior to adopting findings exempting a public improvement contract from competitive bidding; and

WHEREAS, such notice requirements have been met and the public hearing held at the regular meeting of the Wilsonville City Council on December 18, 2006; and

WHEREAS, the proposed work is of an intricate and unique nature that requires special experience and expertise; and

WHEREAS, the project benefits of hiring the right contractor are very clear and will likely end up saving the City costs in the long run; and

WHEREAS, IMD has established a reputation as a fabricator of unique and challenging projects successfully completing projects including a number of similarly challenging fabrications; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and appropriate for the fabricator to work with the designers during design to evaluate complex technical construction elements including materials, methods, details, constructability and cost; and

WHEREAS, IMD has worked closely with Mayer/Reed during the design process over the last two years to develop a fabrication and installation budget and understand the complexities of this project; and WHEREAS, the City desires to execute a contract agreement in a timely manner to preclude further construction cost inflation impacts to the project; and

WHEREAS, the City's adopted FY06-07 budget includes a \$17,764,275.00 appropriation for the Boeckman Road project.

NOW, THEREFORE, CITY OF WILSONVILLE RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. City Council acting as the City of Wilsonville's Local Contract Review Board approves and adopts the above findings and determines it is in the best public interest and welfare to exempt the contract for fabrication and installation of artistic interpretive elements on the Boeckman Road bridge from competitive bidding and solicitation requirements and authorizes execution of a special-procurement contract for such services with Innovative Metal Designs, LLC.
- 2. City Council hereby approves the form of the contract between the City of Wilsonville and Innovative Metal Designs, LLC., and authorizes execution of the contract for fabrication and installation of artistic interpretive elements on the new Boeckman Road bridge, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully set forth as shown in Exhibit A.
- 3. For this contract, Council authorizes expenditures from the amount budgeted for the Boeckman Road project adopted in the FY 2006-07 Budget as follows:

BOECKMAN ROAD EXTENSION PROJECT ARTWORK & SIGN FABRICATION AND INSTALLATION AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into as of the date first indicated on the signature page, by and between the City of Wilsonville, Wilsonville, Oregon, a municipal corporation of the State of Oregon, hereinafter called "City", and Innovative Metal Design, LLC, hereinafter called "Contractor."

WHEREAS, City has need for the services of a company with a particular training, ability, knowledge, and experience possessed by Contractor, and

WHEREAS, City has determined that Contractor is qualified and capable of performing the professional services as City does hereinafter require, under the terms and conditions set forth hereafter:

THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1. SCOPE OF WORK

Contractor shall initiate services upon receipt of an executed copy of this Agreement. Contractor agrees to complete work that is detailed in Exhibit A – Proposal, and by this reference made a part hereof.

ARTICLE 2. EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION

This Agreement shall become effective from the date of execution by both parties and shall expire when tasks required hereunder are complete and accepted, unless earlier terminated or extended in accordance herewith. In the event that a change order causes justifiable delay, the expiration date shall be extended for such reasonable time as determined by mutual agreement of the parties.

ARTICLE 3. COMPENSATION

The City agrees to pay Contractor, on a time and material basis, an estimated amount of One Hundred Seventy Two Thousand Nine Hundred Seventy Two and No/100 dollars (\$172,972.00) for performance of those services described in Exhibit A. All project expenses are included in the Lump Sum Agreement amount; there will be no additional reimbursable expenses. The City shall have no liability for taxes, insurance, or other expenses associated with the performance of the Contractor's duties described in Exhibit A.

City shall be responsible for payment of required fees, payable to governmental agencies including, but not limited to plan checking, land use, zoning, building permits, and all other similar fees resulting from this project, and not specifically covered by Exhibit A.

ARTICLE 4. CONTRACTOR AS INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

Contractor acknowledges that for all purposes related to this Agreement, Contractor is and shall be deemed to be an independent contractor as defined by ORS 670.600 and not an officer, employee or agent of City, shall not be entitled to benefits of any kind to which an officer, employee or agent of City is entitled and shall be solely responsible for all payments, insurance, taxes and or other expenses associated with the performance of the Contractor's duties required by law.

ARTICLE 5. INDEMNIFICATION

Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the City, its officers and employees, from and against all claims, demands, penalties, damages, losses, expenses, including attorney's fees, and causes of action of any kind or character, including the cost of defense thereof, arising or alleged to have risen in favor of any person on account of personal injury, death, or damage to property arising out of or resulting from, or alleged to have risen out of or resulted from in whole or in part, any act or omission of the applicant, the applicant's design engineer, the applicant's contractor, or anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable.

Article 6. Standard of Services and Warranty

City has relied upon the professional ability and training of Contractor as a material inducement to enter into this Agreement. The Contractor agrees to perform and warrants that his/her services will be of the quality and of the standard of care, skill, and diligence normally provided by a professional individual in the performance of similar services as well as the requirements of applicable federal, state and local laws.

Contractor is to check their own work for quality and accuracy before inspection by others. Contractor understands that all work is subject to inspections by the City, Architect, Engineer, or any other person or persons authorized by the City. Inspections shall not unduly delay the work. Any work found to be defective or not to the specification requirements will be repaired and / or replaced by the Contractor. Any defect in workmanship that is not detected will not constitute acceptance of the work.

ARTICLE 7. INSURANCE

Contractor shall maintain insurance acceptable to City in full force and effect throughout the term of this contract. Such insurance shall cover all risks arising directly or indirectly out of Contractor's activities or work hereunder.

The policy or policies of insurance maintained by the Contractor shall provide at least the following limits and coverages:

a. Commercial General Liability Insurance

Contractor shall obtain, at Contractor's expense, and keep in effect during the term of this contract, Comprehensive General Liability Insurance covering Bodily Injury and Property Damage on an "occurrence" form (1996 ISO or equivalent). This coverage shall include Contractual Liability insurance for the indemnity provided under this contract. The following insurance will be carried:

b. Business Automobile Liability Insurance

If Contractor will be using a motor vehicle in the performance of the services herein, Contractor shall provide City a certificate indicating that Contractor has business automobile liability coverage for all owned, hired, and non-owned vehicles. The Combined Single Limit per occurrence shall not be less than \$1,000,000. Said insurance shall name City as an additional insured and shall require written notice to City thirty (30) days in advance of cancellation.

c. Workers' Compensation Insurance

The Contractor and all employers providing work, labor or materials under this Contract that are either subject employers under the Oregon Workers' Compensation Law and shall comply with ORS 656.017, which requires them to provide workers' compensation coverage that satisfies Oregon law for all their subject workers or employers that are exempt under ORS 656.126. Out-of-state employers must provide Oregon workers' compensation coverage for their

workers who work at a single location within Oregon for more than 30 days in a calendar year. Contractors who perform work without the assistance or labor of any employee need not obtain such coverage. This shall include Employer's Liability Insurance with coverage limits of not less than \$500,000 each accident.

d. Insurance Carrier Rating

Coverages provided by the Contractor must be underwritten by an insurance company deemed acceptable by the City. The City reserves the right to reject all or any insurance carrier(s) with an unacceptable financial rating.

e. Certificates of Insurance

As evidence of the insurance coverage required by the contract, the Contractor shall furnish a Certificate of Insurance to the City that states: "The following is included as additional insured: City of Wilsonville, its elected and appointed officials, officers, agents, employees and volunteers." No contract shall be effected until the required certificates have been received and approved by the City.

ARTICLE 8. TERMINATION

The parties agree that any decision by either party to terminate this Agreement before the expiration date shall be accompanied by sixty (60) days written notice to the other party prior to the date termination would take effect. There shall be no penalty for early termination. If City terminates the contract pursuant to this paragraph, it shall pay Contractor for services rendered prorated to the date of termination.

ARTICLE 9. AGREEMENT MODIFICATIONS

Modifications to this Agreement are valid only if made in writing and signed by all parties.

ARTICLE 10. SUBCONTRACTING

No portion of the Agreement may be subcontracted to any other individual, firm, or entity without the express and prior written approval of the City.

ARTICLE 11. NON-ASSIGNMENT

No portion of nor any interest in this Agreement may be assigned to a third party without the express and prior written approval of the City.

ARTICLE 12. OWNERSHIP OF WORK PRODUCT

City shall be entitled to ownership and possession of any and all work products, at no additional cost during the products' useful lifetime, including any computations, plans, correspondence or pertinent data and information gathered by or computed by Contractor prior to termination of this Agreement by Contractor or upon completion of the work pursuant to this Agreement.

Contractor shall bear the risk of loss until the goods have been delivered to the site and installed to the satisfaction of the City. Contractor agrees to carry insurance to cover any losses/damages to City's goods while in Contractor's possession.

ARTICLE 13. GOVERNING LAW

Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws; and rules and regulations on non-discrimination in employment because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religion, sex, marital status, age, medical condition or disability. The provisions of this Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the State of Oregon. All provisions required by ORS Chapter 279 to be included in a contract of this type are incorporated into this Agreement as though fully set forth herein. Any action or suits involving any question arising under this Agreement must be brought in the appropriate court of the State of Oregon.

ARTICLE 14. COMPLETE AGREEMENT

This Agreement and attached exhibit(s) constitute the entire Agreement between the parties. No waiver, consent, modification, or change of terms of this Agreement shall bind either party unless in writing and signed by both parties. Such waiver, consent, modification, or change if made, shall be effective only in specific instances and for the specific purpose given. There are no understandings, agreements, or representations, oral or written, not specified herein regarding this Agreement.

ARTICLE 15. SURVIVAL

The warranties, indemnifications and other acts required to be performed beyond the term of this Agreement shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 16. GENERAL PROVISIONS

Contractor recognizes that other contractors and/or vendors will be working on the site at the time of Project commencement, and this will require the cooperation and coordination of all parties for successful completion.

Contractor is aware of all scheduling and site conditions and is aware of coordination with other trades and has included all costs that may be anticipated. Contractor shall perform and complete its work in accordance with the Boeckman Road Extension General Contractor's project schedule and shall coordinate daily activities with General Contractor.

Claims, disputes or other matters in question between the parties to this Agreement arising out of or relating to this Agreement or breach thereof shall be subject to and decided by mediation or arbitration. Such mediation or arbitration shall be conducted in accordance with the Construction Industry Mediation or Arbitration Rules of the American Arbitration Service of Portland currently in effect. Any mediation or arbitration costs shall be split equally between the parties.









SUBJECT: A Resolution exempting the contract for fabrication and installation of sculptural bronze artwork with interpretive elements at the new Boeckman Road Bridge from formal competitive solicitation requirements, awarding the contract to Innovative Metal Design, LLC (IMD)

Background: The City's capital improvement project extending Boeckman Road from 95th to Tooze Road is currently under construction. One element of this road extension project is a new 400 foot long bridge which will span Coffee Lake Creek (Seely Ditch).

This bridge will include a 10-foot wide multi-use trail which will be a section of the regional Tonquin Trail. As the bridge will carry pedestrian and bicycle traffic in addition to vehicular traffic, there is an opportunity to enhance both the visual and educational experience and create added value to the streetscape and public infrastructure. The new bridge will provide a special contextual opportunity to observe the adjacent wetland habitat. Artistic and interpretive elements placed in this location would invite pedestrians and cyclists to take pause and notice the changes in the land forms and ecosystems of the area and provide educational material for review.

Staff has been working with Mayer/Reed to design artistic and interpretive elements to be included on the bridge. The completed design includes an interpretive pylon at each end of the bridge imbedded with sign panels to provide information on the history of the geology, flora and fauna of the area, and stone planters accentuated with sculptural elements representing local wetland flora (see attached exhibits).

Since the design consists of sculptural bronze pieces with interpretive elements which are complex, distinctive pieces of art, it is essential the pieces be manufactured and installed by artisans uniquely suited to this type of work. Staff has determined it is necessary to identify a specific contractor capable of the attention to detail and fine craftsmanship needed for fabricating and installing these sorts of unique pieces of artwork.

The project designers, Mayer/Reed, have worked closely with Innovative Metal Design, LLC (IMD) and their team of artisans on the design of interpretive and artistic pieces for



the Boeckman Road bridge. IMD has provided Mayer/Reed with guidance on structural detailing, material sourcing, sizing, metal finish options, and cost estimating.

Mayer/Reed has also worked with IMD on several other unique projects over the years. These projects include a sculptural icon incorporating complex metal fabrication and custom burnished finishes at the Eastern Washington State Historical Society Museum in Spokane; a steel and bronze campus landmark integrated into a stone masonry wall at Pacific Lutheran University in Seattle; and illuminated steel and glass kiosks marking the Portland Art Museum's three entries

The cost estimate for fabricating and installing the designed interpretive art elements is \$190,270.00, including 10% contingency. This amount represents 0.77% of the cost of the entire Boeckman Road extension project.

Recommendation: Staff recommends City Council adopt the Resolution exempting the contract for fabrication and installation of sculptural bronze artwork with interpretive elements on the Boeckman Road Extension project from formal competitive selection requirements. As IMD has a complete understanding of the design's fabrication, structural engineering and artistic requirements, and is experienced in fabricating and installing such unique pieces of art, staff further recommends that Council authorize the execution of an exempt contract for such services with IMD.
