

RESOLUTION NO. 633

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF WILSONVILLE, CLACKAMAS AND WASHINGTON COUNTIES, OREGON, CALLING AN ELECTION TO SUBMIT TO THE VOTERS THE QUESTION OF AMENDING THE WILSONVILLE CODE TO ALLOW OUTDOOR INVENTORY DISPLAY IN COMMERCIAL ZONES.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Wilsonville has received a request to amend the Wilsonville Code to allow open inventory display in commercial zones; and

WHEREAS, the issue of allowing open inventory display has generated considerable public concern both in favor and in opposition; and

WHEREAS, the Wilsonville City Council has determined that an election to decide the issue of allowing open inventory display will allow the maximum public input.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE CITY OF WILSONVILLE RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

A. An election is hereby called for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the city the question of amending the Wilsonville City Code to Allow Outdoor Inventory Display in Commercial Zones.

B. The election hereby called shall be held in the City on the 3rd day of November, 1987.

C. The City Recorder shall cause to be delivered to the Elections Officers of Clackamas and Washington Counties the attached Notice of Election. The Elections Officers shall conduct the election as required by law.


D. The City Recorder shall give notice of the election by posting notice in three public places at least two weeks prior to the election.

*EXPLANATION: The Wilsonville City Code presently does not allow the outdoor
display of open inventories in commercial zones. If this measure is approved,
open display would be allowed in all commercial zones. Outdoor sales such as
nursery stock, cars, recreational vehicles, boats and home improvement displays
would be allowed to locate in Wilsonville's commercial zones. These businesses
would be subject to city development standards. Restrictions including
spacing, landscaping, and lot size would be applied.

SUBJECT: Election on Open Inventory Display

Attached is the resolution calling for the election on the open inventory display issue. The ballot measure itself was written to be as fair and clear as possible. It has been reviewed and approved by the City Attorney. It would be possible for the Council to change the wording should it desire, but the limitations on ballot measures are strict. The explanation section for a ballot measure, for example, is limited to 75 words and the one submitted in the resolution currently has 74 words.

Mr. Meyer requested and has been allowed to review the ballot measure prior to the meeting. I don't know if he will offer any concerns or comments, but the Council is the final judge of how the ballot measure will be worded.
