RESOLUTION NO. 654

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SIGN LIQUOR LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATIONS.

WHEREAS, the City of Wilsonville receives a large number of liquor license renewal applications each year for recommendation to the Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) for approval or denial; and

WHEREAS, the City has had a practice of placing liquor license renewals on the consent agenda at City Council meetings; and

WHEREAS, this can be an inefficient system and lend to delays in recommendations due to the scheduling of City Council meetings; and

WHEREAS, recommendations for approval of liquor license renewals are a routine matter in all instances except those for a licensed establishment with a poor record of liquor-related violations;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Wilsonville that:

1. The Mayor is authorized by the City Council to sign all approvals for liquor license renewals unless the establishment has had a history during the previous year of liquor-related violations.

2. Should a licensed establishment have liquor-related violations which may be cause for a recommendation not to renew a license, a public hearing shall be scheduled and the recommendation to renew or not renew a license shall be made by the City Council after the conclusion of the public hearing.
